Celebrating Our Rich History

June 17th marked the Blessing and Dedication of our Alumni Afghan at the Innovation and Learning Center at Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center. The Alumni Afghan was a gift to the St. Francis Foundation and thanks to Whitney Dionne the afghan was beautifully framed by the carpentry staff of SFHMC. Our Alumni Afghan was made possible through the efforts of Toni McNally and her committee in 1997. The afghan is a pictorial rendition of A Century of the History of Nursing Education at the Saint Francis Hospital School of Nursing.

Mother Ann Valencia founded Saint Francis Hospital in 1897. She saw the need to staff the hospital with nurses, so in 1899, she and her colleague, Sr. Jeanne Teresa started the nursing school located within the hospital. In 1902, Sr. Jeanne Teresa and another Sister of St. Joseph graduated, starting the long line of what was to become a total of 5,818 graduates. Sr. Jeanne Teresa became the first director of the school and remained the director for nearly 40 years. Under her supervision, the school, which started with humble beginnings, became the cutting edge of nursing education as its graduates passed the State Board of Registration Exams and was the first in Connecticut to be accepted by the New York State Board of Regents, and affiliated with the American Nurses Association. Succeeding Sr. Jeanne was Sr. Mary Mechtilde. The home base of our nurses was then located at 340 Collins Street.

During the war years, Sr. Mechtilde, always the nurse educator, recognized the need to have nurses serve. She provided the military with a cadre of Cadet Nurses to assist with the war effort. During Sister's tenure, nursing classes expanded to over 100 students annually. In 1959, Sr. Mechtilde handed over the reins to Sr. Mary Gertrude. She made many curriculum changes; strengthening academic preparation of our nurses.

Sr. Gertrude was followed by Sr. Dennis Marie, who was the last Sister of St. Joseph to be the Director of Saint Francis Hospital School of Nursing. Under her direction, the school was moved to the Bond Hotel and was renamed DeSales Hall. Sister was responsible for major curriculum changes, keeping up with new trends and directions in nursing, thereby changing the 3-year to a 2-year diploma program. The school was later moved to Ashley Street, now known as "The Innovation and

Learning Center."

It should be noted that since 1905, when State Boards were instituted, our graduates, second to none, achieved excellent pass rates on their first writing. One occasion was 92%, but generally, 100% was our norm.

In 1994, Dr. Rosemary Hathway became the first and last lay director of Saint Francis Hospital School of Nursing.

Today, in most health care areas, caps are no longer used. However, throughout our country, and in many parts of the world — be it hospital settings, clinics, schools, home care or volunteer areas — one can readily identify the Saint Francis Nurse, proudly wearing our pin, lettered with AMDG, from the Latin: Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam, "For the Greater Glory of God".

Despite our outstanding record of producing excellent practitioners, given the rapid changes in health care and nursing education, in 1995, management at the hospital decided that a nursing school was no longer feasible at Saint Francis. On June 15, 1997, the school closed its doors, leaving as its legacy:

98 Years of Excellence

All of our lives were touched by the humble beginnings of the Saint Francis Hospital School of Nursing family, who in turn, enabled us to reach out and touch the lives of so many others. We are grateful to all of them!
